The Rumworth Morris of Bolton was founded in 1976 and they dance a traditional North-west style of Morris. The all-male troop, made up

of 14 dancers and five musicians, aged 11 to 66, perform four times a year and rehearse once a month at Deane Church hall. Rumworth.

Founding member Peter Bearon, aged 52, said: "We perform Lancashire Morris which was traditionally associated with church rush carts.

"We dance in clogs and use ropes instead of hankies.

"We've performed at all the major folk festivals and even in The Albert Hall in London. It's a good way to keep fit because it can be quite energetic and it's nice to feel part of a tradition.
